

## **AMBASSADORS TO THE UN PAID A COURTESY CALL TO THE ACC**

On 9 March 2010, a cross section of Ambassadors to the United Nations paid a courtesy call to the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC). The Commissioner, Mr. Abdul Tejan-Cole, in his address enlightened the visitors about how the Commission is formed. Mr. Tejan-Cole further went to brief the visitors about the functions, mandate and core values of the Commission. "The major challenge the Commission is facing is the construction of a permanent office space in Freetown and the security of its staff," the Commissioner added. He wooed for support to minimizing corruption in Sierra Leone.

Directors from the Public Education and External Outreach, Systems and Processes Review, Intelligence, Investigations and Prosecution, Support Services Departments and the National Anti-Corruption Strategy Secretariat, also gave highlights of their activities.

The Ambassadors later asked questions among which were building on the capacity of ACC staff and the strategy the Commission uses to tackle money laundry.
